2015 Domaine de l'Amauve Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret Estelles

The 2015 Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret Estelles (75% Grenache and 25% Syrah) was completely destemmed and spent 12 months in 50% new barrels and 50% tank. Forward, charming, medium-bodied and nicely textured, with pretty notes of baking spices, sweet cherries, dried flowers and a hints of vanilla, it shows a touch of modern style and will drink nicely through 2023.

2015 Domaine de l'Amauve Cotes du Rhone Villages Seguret Les Merrelies

Still in barrel, the limited production 2015 Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret Les Merrelies is comprised of 75% Grenache and 25% Syrah, and is raised in older barrels. It has more mid-palate depth and richness as well as lots of kirsch, savory cherries, dried spices and licorice aromas and flavors. It shows a hint of barrique, but I like its fruit, it has good concentration and sweet tannin, all suggesting it will drink nicely for 6-7 years.

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2015 Domaine de l'Amauve Cotes du Rhone Villages Seguret Daurele

The 2015 Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret Daurèle is a rock-solid blend of 42% Grenache Blanc, 28% Clairette, 18% Viognier and the rest Ugni-Blanc raised mostly in tank (15% was in two- to three-year-old barrels). It offers lots of citrus blossom, mint, green citrus and crushed rock aromas and flavors, and has both freshness and depth on the palate. I suspect it will age gracefully and I wouldn't be surprised to see it still going strong at age ten and beyond.
